# **Guidelines for Submission of Abstract**

- Original research studies/systematic reviews /narrative reviews related to health science research will be accepted
- 2. The word limit for the abstract is 500
- 3. The abstract should be uploaded in PDF format
- 4. The last date to submit the abstract is 30 April, 2025
- 5. The abstract title should be brief (maximum 20 words)
- 6. The abstract for original research studies/systematic reviews/narrative reviews should include:
  - i. Introduction/Background
  - ii. Objectives
  - iii. Methods and materials, including ethical considerations
  - iv. Results/ Discussion
  - v. Conclusion
- 7. Indicate the preferred method of presentation: Paper/Poster
- 8. Indicate the theme category
- 9. Submitting the declaration form is mandatory to approve the abstract (format is available on the website)
- 10. The scientific committee will send the confirmation mail and a tracking number for future correspondence
- 11. The abstract will be checked for similarity index. If the content is found to be plagiarised, it will be sent back to the presenting author for modification
- 12. All the abstracts will be reviewed, and reviewers' decision will be the final in deciding the mode of presentation (Paper/poster)
- 13. Approved abstracts will be notified on or before 15th May 2025. (15 days of submission)
- 14. The detailed guidelines for the Paper/Poster presentation will be informed once the abstract is accepted
- 15. Best presentation (Paper and Poster) will be awarded
- 16. Only the presenting author will receive a certificate for the oral presentation. Two authors will receive a certificate for the poster presentation, and both authors should register for the conference
- 17. Presented papers (Paper/posters) will be published in the conference proceedings
