## Call for papers and posters.

Healthcare professionals, academicians, researchers, and students interested in presenting at the conference can submit an abstract using the Google form link.

#### **Guidelines for abstract submission:**

- 1. Original research studies/systematic reviews /narrative reviews related to health science research will be accepted.

  High-quality experience papers on nurse-led clinics also will be accepted.
- 2. The word limit for the abstract is 500.
- 3. The abstract should be uploaded in PDF format in Google form.
- 4. The last date to submit the abstract is 20<sup>th</sup> December 2023.
- 5. The abstract title should be brief (maximum 20 words).
- 6. The abstract for original research studies/systematic reviews/narrative reviews should include:
  - i. Introduction/Background
  - ii. Objectives
  - iii. Methods and materials, including ethical considerations.
  - iv. Results/ Discussion
  - v. Conclusion
- 7. The abstract for experience papers should include:
  - i. Introduction
  - ii. Description
  - iii. Impact
  - iv. Summary
- 8. Indicate the preferred method of presentation: Oral/Poster
- 9. Indicate the theme category.
- 10. Submitting the declaration form is mandatory to approve the abstract (format is available on the website).
- 11. The scientific committee will send you a confirmation mail and a tracking number for future correspondence.
- 12. The abstract will be checked for similarity index. If the content is found to be plagiarised, it will be sent back to the presenting author for modification.
- 13. The scientific committee will scrutinise all the submitted abstracts and decide on the presentation method (Oral/Poster).
- 14. Approved abstracts will be notified on or before 1st January 2024.
- 15. The detailed guidelines for the Oral/Poster presentation will be informed once the abstract is accepted.
- 16. Best presentation (Oral and Poster) will be awarded.
- 17. Only the presenting author will receive a certificate for the oral presentation. Two authors will receive a certificate for the poster presentation, and both authors should register for the conference.
