fore setting out to change oth-ers. "We still have 300 million people without electricity. The highest maternal deaths is due to indoor air pollution. One mil-lion women and children die of non women and endored die of indoor air pollution in the world and 75% of the deceased are Indians. How can we leave in peace when such a large pro-portion of people are dying? As long as this situation exists and

poverty exists, we are all anti-nationals. What is the point in soring we are the largest econ-omy in the world? The issue of clean water in Orissa and ar-senic in West Bengal, basic ed-toation still looms high.
